AARP Driver Safety Course offered on Wednesday, May 4

The AARP Driver Safety Course is a classroom-based refresher course for drivers 50 years old and older. Its purpose is to keep older drivers on the road longer and safer. The nominal fee, \$12 for AARP members and \$14 for non-members, covers the cost of delivering the program, including a very popular 120-page Participant Workbook, which is yours to keep. Clint Smoke will be the instructor.

The new version of the course is just four hours and will be presented at the church on Wednesday, May 4, starting at 10:00 am. Refreshments and lunch will be provided. The course is open to the public.

This course will help you tune-up your driving skills and update your knowledge of the rules of the road; learn about normal age-related physical changes, and how to adjust your driving to allow for these changes; reduce your traffic violations, crashes, and chances for injuries; and drive safer.

All children, youth and adults are invited to participate in the Palm Sunday procession at the 10:55 worship service.



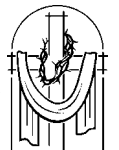
Maundy Thursday, April 21

Good Friday, April 22

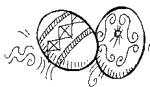

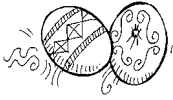

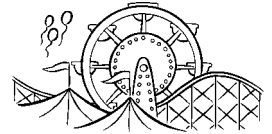

- What can make a guard wake up at 3am and drive 75 miles to volunteer to work for a Kairos weekend?...A Kairos cookie.
- What can warm the hearts of inmates who feel unloved, isolated and forgotten? ... A Kairos cookie.
- What can bring joy to inmates in a maximum security prison?... A Kairos cookie.
- What can make gang members tear down the walls of unforgiveness and years of animosity? ... A Kairos cookie.
- What can bring a smile to the face of a hardened criminal? ... A Kairos cookie.
- What can make an inmate want to give a dozen cookies to someone they need to forgive, or need to seek forgiveness from someone within the walls of their prison? ... Kairos cookies.

Last year we were over 1,000 dozen cookies short of our goal of 3,400 dozen. Every day during the weekend at Marion Correctional, the Kairos team plans to hand out—with the love of Christ—a dozen homemade, prayed over, cookies to every inmate in his cell. - July 2: No F.I.S.H. – 4th of July holiday weekend!



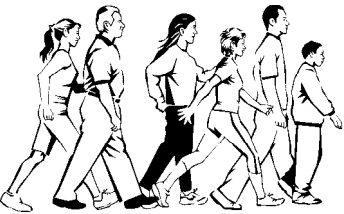

On Thursday, April 21, from 8:30-10:30 am, Maureen Carr, Parish Nurse performs Lipid Panel (Total Cholesterol, good and bad cholesterol, triglycerides, blood sugar) screenings in Senior resource Center (Room 318). You need to have been fasting 8-12 hours. There is a \$15 charge to cover supplies. No appointments are necessary. Just come and be informed of your cholesterol and blood sugar numbers.

How are your blood pressure readings? Come April 24 and see

There will be a blood pressure screening on Sunday, April 24, from 9:30-10:45 am in the Senior Resource Center which is located behind the Reception Desk.

Elevated blood pressure raises your heart disease risk plus can affect your eyes, and kidneys. So Remember:

- Normal blood pressure is less than 120/80
- Pre-Hypertension is 120-139/80-89
- Stage 1 Hypertension is 140-159/90-99
- Stage 2 Hypertension is 160 and higher/100 and higher
