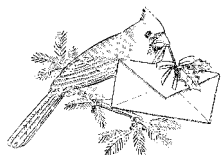

## Dominican Republic Intergeneration Mission Team Presentation on Sunday, December 11

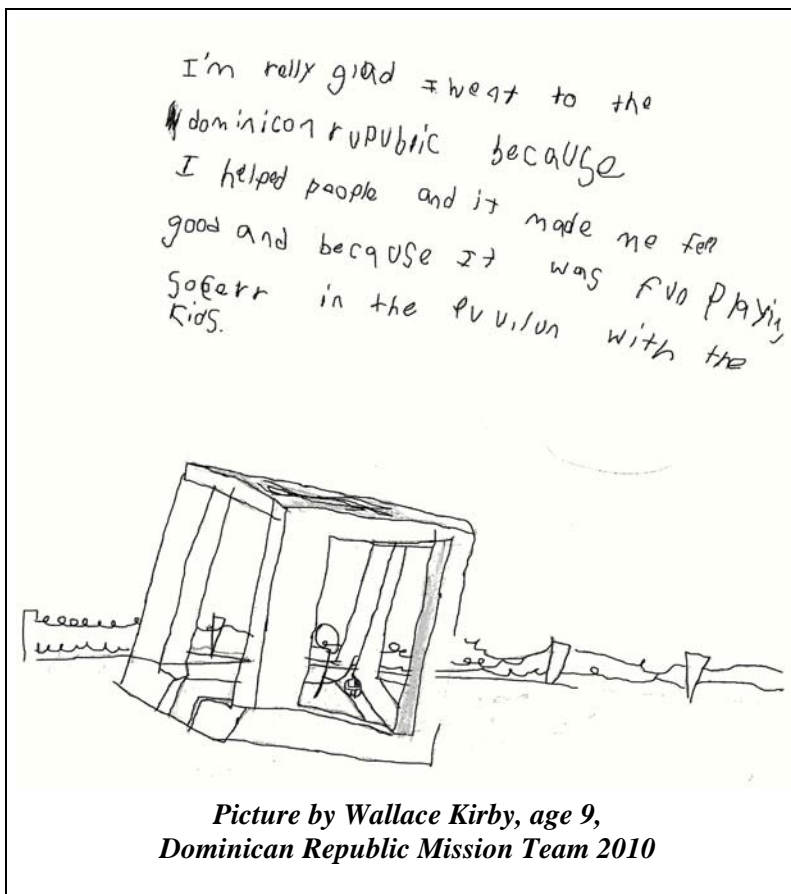
