## Sunday, January 2, marks Epiphany

In western Christian tradition, Epiphany is celebrated the first Sunday in January. Epiphany is the climax of the Advent/Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas which are usually counted from the evening of December 25 until the morning of January 6, which is the Twelfth Day.

The term *epiphany* means "to show" or even "to reveal." It remembers the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by so doing "reveal" Jesus to the world as Lord and King. The colors of Epiphany are usually the colors of Christmas, white and gold—the colors of celebration, newness, and hope that mark the most sacred days of the church year.

As with most aspects of the Christian liturgical calendar, Epiphany has theological significance as a teaching tool in the church. The Wise Men or Magi who brought gifts to the child Jesus were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as "King" and so were the first to "show" or "reveal" Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ. This act of worship by the Magi, which corresponded to Simeon's blessing that this child Jesus would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32), was one of the first indications that Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and that the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few.

Asheville Christian Publishing Company Grateful Steps, owned by Central’s Micki Cabaniss Eutsler, opened a bookstore this month in downtown Asheville at 159 South Lexington Avenue. Rob Blackburn conducted the interfaith dedication service on November 5, 2010.

Author Carrie Blackburn Brown and Illustrator Cindy Kinser of Central, told the story behind *The Best Cupcake Ever*, published by Grateful Steps. All proceeds from sale of the book go to the Kory Wawanaca Children’s Home in Bolivia.

## Central's Snow Policy for Saturdays at Six



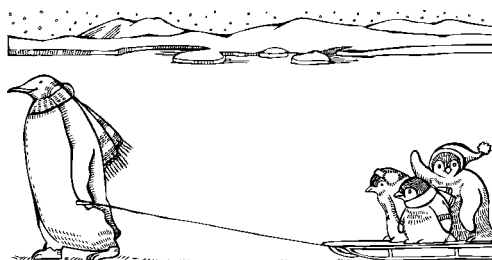
Because this service is at night—when travel could be more treacherous—there are times when the Saturdays at Six worship service may be cancelled due to bad weather.

# Prison Ministry

## What happens at a Kairos weekend in prison

During the weekend there are 11 talks presented by Clergy and Lay persons. After each talk there is two minutes of silence for contemplation followed by a 20 minute family discussion about what the talk meant to them. Then as a family project the participants will make a poster in which they express their feelings about the talk. On the end of the day before going to the chapel, each family selects 2 posters and explains the meaning of the poster to the entire group.

*“I was in prison and you came to me” (Matt 25:36)*

A typical 3½ day Kairos weekend needs 57 or more volunteers, 44 who go inside the penitentiary. The prison’s chaplain will select 42 inmates to participate. They will be divided into 7 table families. Each family consists of 6 inmates, a family leader, assistant family leader, a clergy, and a servant.

- Normal blood pressure is less than 120/80
- Pre-Hypertension is 120-139/80-89
- Stage 1 Hypertension is 140-159/90-99
- Stage 2 Hypertension is 160 and higher/100 and higher
