Widening the Circle



The small south Georgia town that I so longed to escape as a teenager is now a tourist attraction of sorts. The trains, that for years have threatened to shake my mother's blue and white plate collection from the walls, are bringing train lovers from across the country to my five traffic light town.

The "Folkston Funnel" is a unique place where railroad tracks converge and train engines of all descriptions can be seen. Little Folkston is the main rail corridor to and from Florida. It is also the place where engines and their hauls merge in from the Northeast.

The Folkston website boasts: "A recent visitor from Tampa told of seeing '41 trains or engine movements and units from seven different railroads.'" This is big stuff for railroad buffs! On a recent visit home, I was fascinated by a picture of men (lots of them!) lined parallel to the train tracks with cameras on tripods aimed down the track. You sensed they would stay there until they saw that which they came to see.

At Central, we are the trains and their hauls funneling through the church doors into a place where we experience Christian fellowship and growth. We walk through the doors bringing in our different and varied gifts and talents.

The good news here is that we, in turn, walk OUT those same doors in order to share our Christianity with those in the community.

We are a reverse funnel in that the door is small, but the effects as we engage with our community are spread in a wide arch. You will see members of our congregation lovingly serving the community and our church in so many ways. Haywood Street Congregation and its programs, our prison ministry, the monthly Community Luncheon, Room in the Inn are just some of the many of the ways we find ways to reach others in our community.

We have a vibrant music ministry, active children and youth ministries, great programs on Wednesdays, and many small group opportunities. Like those men lined near the railroad, you will be able to snap many photographs of all types of Christian compassion and helping hands if you just watch what our congregation is doing for ourselves and for the community. There is so much happening, you will soon see what you came to find!

Become a Stephen Minister



What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a ministry designed to help people who are undergoing a crisis or difficult time in their life. We all can use a friend to talk with us about our grief over the loss of a loved one, help us through the pain of divorce, walk with us through the transition into retirement or loss of a job, pray with us during a difficult medical diagnosis. Stephen Ministry is here for you.

Who is a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministers are caring Christian people who have the time to devote to fellow Christian friend going through a difficult time. Stephen ministers are able to keep their conversations private and are trained to handle even the most difficult of situations.

What if I need a friend to help me? How can I receive a Stephen Minister?

Just contact Julie (989-9659) or a Stephen Minister in our congregation. Julie will talk with you to find the best Stephen Minister for you. Every conversation is handled with confidentiality and respect.

What is required to become a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministers are trained by Central's Stephen Ministry team. Everyone is required to attend 50 hours of training. We ask that you fill out an application and meet with our Stephen Leaders prior to the training. Stephen Ministers are able to keep confidentiality (you will be trained on this).

**Stephen Ministry training begins Thursday, September 2 at 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm
and will be held every Thursday evening.**

Nursery care is available for V.B.S. staff

As you arrive each morning, you will check in at the table in front of the Fellowship Hall:

- Parents will walk 2 and 3 year old children directly to their classroom on the first floor.
- Children 4 years old – 5th grade will then go into the Fellowship Hall to meet their family leaders (to be in these groups, children must be entering kindergarten in the fall of 2010).

Morning arrival will begin at 8:30. All children need to arrive by 8:45.

After opening assembly children will begin their Bible time adventure as they enjoy recreation, drama, crafts, snacks, family time, music, missions and more.

All activities will introduce children to the culture of ancient Egypt as we learn about Joseph and his journey from prison to palace.

Dismissal will begin each day at 12:30.

Children will be dismissed from the Fellowship Hall. You may walk up to the Fellowship Hall or drive up on Church Street to pick up your child.

Prison Ministry

James is 34 years old. He has 15 more years in prison to go. He has a beautiful wife.

He loved her so much he set her free so she might remarry and have a good life.

His 15 year old son plays football at Erwin but he will never see him play.

Why didn't somebody tell me?

“Before I lost my business, before I lost my family, before I lost my dignity, before I nearly killed three persons, before I was given 20 years in prison, why didn't somebody tell me? My parents didn't go to church. I grew up believing there was no God. I lived one day at a time. What happened, happened. There was no rhyme or reason, just luck, just fate.

I came to Kairos because it was something to do. I had no idea what I was in for. That banana was made by God the man said. You were made by Him too. He loves you. He wants only the best for you. Our choices get us into trouble. Cost us our most precious things, family, business, our dignity.

But nobody ever told me there was a God.”

By the way, James met Jesus on Saturday night at Kairos Number 4 at Marion Correctional Center. Through the big man's tears he kept asking, “Why didn't somebody tell me before?”

The next time you are feeling guilty for urging your children to come to church and they whine and don't want to go, remember James. Today he wishes somebody had told him.

How Are Your Blood Pressure Readings?

There will be blood pressure screening on Sunday, June 27, from 9:30-10:45 am in the Senior Resource Center which is located behind the Reception Desk.

Elevated blood pressure raises your heart disease risk plus can affect your eyes, and kidneys. So Remember:

- Normal blood pressure is less than 120/80
- Pre-Hypertension is 120-139/80-89
- Stage 1 Hypertension is 140-159/90-99
- Stage 2 Hypertension is 160 and higher/100 and higher



Lipid Screening on Thursday, June 24

On Thursday, June 24, from 8:30-10:30 am, Maureen Carr, Parish Nurse performs Lipid Panel (Total Cholesterol, good and bad cholesterol, triglycerides, blood sugar) screenings in Senior Resource Center (Room 318). You will get better results if you have been fasting 8-12 hours. There is a \$15 charge to cover supplies. No appointments are necessary. Just come and be informed of your cholesterol and blood sugar numbers.

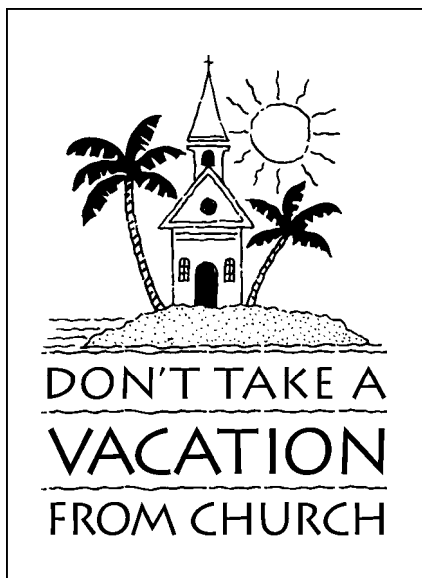
